

SUCCESS STORY – PHIN SOKHA



In 2016 Sokha commenced a one-year course in Business Management at university in Kampot. On completing this course she hopes to find work to suit her qualifications in the commercial sector.

She is one of six children who grew up in Chumkriek. Her father provided for the family by raising livestock, but income was irregular, depending on when he had stock to sell. Her mother passed away in 2012.

Between 2008 and 2012 Sokha attended State School. An able student, she was assisted through her schooling with a CLS scholarship which provided school supplies and uniforms. She also attended English lessons at the CLS Evening School.

On leaving school, Sokha secured a job as a Cashier at the Green House Guesthouse and Restaurant outside Kampot. She also returned to help at CLS as an Evening School teacher, but gave up this role when she had a baby. She hopes to return to teaching in the future, as she is passionately committed to – in her words – “supporting the community that supported her”!

Sokha has already benefited from schooling to gain a secure and fulfilling job. She is now embarking on further studies to seek a career in business, leaving behind the struggles of her childhood years to blaze a new path – for herself and for others to follow.
