Summary

"CLS definitely helped me to have a better life. As a student, I got the scholarship from CLS. By knowing English, I got opportunity to study abroad. Finally, I got a job as bridge inspector which I also need to use English as well" (CLS past student)

In 2023 Chumkriel Language School (CLS) surveyed past students to evaluate how CLS has impacted them. Without doubt the education these past students received at CLS was life changing; providing job opportunities, confidence, friendships, a broader view of the world and positive life skills.

The majority of people who responded to this survey are relatively young between 16 and 25 years old, most are still living in Kampot Province. Most had left CLS between 6 to 10 years ago. All except one person had completed grade 12 and over half had completed university studies. About half had jobs and many were still studying. Everyone said CLS's English and computer classes helped them either get a job or continue their studies and that attending CLS gave them a better life.

Most people said they can speak, read and write English with a good or some understanding.

What they liked about CLS was learning English and computer skills, making friends, playing sport, interacting with foreigners/volunteers, good teachers and resources, further study and job opportunities.

Some people would have liked closer relationship between teachers and students, and more opportunity to speak English rather than to study English.

Everyone found attending CLS helped them in some way and most people wanted to continue with their studies.

Background

<u>Chumkriel Language School</u> (CLS) is a small Cambodian operated grass roots NGO providing accessible education and assistance to the local community.

CLS offers a variety of education and community support programs promoting improved life skills for the people of Chumkriel and neighbouring rural communities. It is staffed by local Cambodians who value the importance of educating the children of this community and of setting a positive example.

CLS fosters recognition of education and self- improvement as a pathway to better employment opportunities and improved lifestyle. We do this by developing our students knowledge and life skills, teaching them English, and providing support and encouragement to their families.

Through continual monitoring and evaluation of our present and past students, we apply knowledge gained from evidence and analysis to improve development outcomes and ensure accountability for the funds and resources from our donors and supporters.



Methodology

In 2023 CLS conducted a survey of past students to evaluate the impact CLS has had on their lives.

Using a custom google form¹, a survey in English and Khmer was distributed via Telegram² to a group of 20 past students.³ These past students were asked to circulate the survey to other past students with whom they were in contact. A total of 29 responses were received in 2 weeks.

In 2023 CLS has 110 students in Learning Centre most of whom included the 320 students attending the English classes. Approximately 30 students graduate each year to high school. CLS has been operating since 2005. Presuming an average of 30 students graduate/leave each year, the survey response was about 5-6% of past students.





Results


1. Most responders (76%) were between 16-25 years old, with about 38% being 16-20 years old and 38% being 21-25 years old. Only 24% were over 25 years old and no one under 16 years old responded.



- 2. Very few responders had moved from Kampot Province. Most responders (72%) still lived in Kampot Province although 24% had moved to another Cambodian province. Only 1 person had moved to Phnom Penh and no one had moved to another country.

- 3. Only 24% of responders had recently left CLS (less than 1 year ago). Most had left 6 to 10 years ago. Only a very small number (4 or 13.8%) were from the 10 year or longer cohort.

4. What education did you complete?


Nearly all responders completed grade 12 and over 55% went onto further studies with 21% undertaking university studies. One person undertake a Bachelor of Engineering in Vietnam.⁴






Comments⁵ included:




- 7. All agreed their studies at CLS helped them get a better life. About 83% responses were unqualified; 17% qualified their responses with following comments⁶:






